

## ARMY CHEF – END POINT ASSESSMENT

### Aim

As part of all Army Chef Apprenticeships there is a requirement for an End Point Assessment (EPA) to take place to confirm all Knowledge, Skills and behaviours have been achieved in line with the relevant assessment plans. ### Duration

The time allocated for EPA to take place is 3 months from gateway approval, the minimum time for gateway is dependent on your apprenticeship, for individual dates please refer to your portfolio or joining letter where this will be clearly annotated.

### Cost and Payment

EPA costs are covered by government funding (Education and Skills Funding Agency) therefore free for the Apprentice.

### Method of Delivery

The EPA for your apprenticeship has been contracted to an End Point Assessment Organisation (EPAO). The EPAO for the Chef CEG is the Army Catering Training Trust (ACTT). They provide EPA for Production Chef, Senior Production Chef and Facilities Management standards.

### EPA Specifics

The *synoptic* EPA will be completed in the workplace, by the EPAO, the EPA consists of different components for each Apprenticeship. Specifics for the EPA can be found in the assessment plans at the following links;

### Mentor Support

All apprentices will be allocated a training mentor at unit who will provide full support to the apprentice as they progress through their apprenticeship and onto their EPA, this will be fully supported by the unit CoC (RCWO/UCM). They will help prepare apprentices for their EPA with the support of the Apprenticeship Warrant Officer.

### Equipment Required

No equipment is formally required to complete the apprenticeship unless remote assessment/support is needed. If equipment is required to carry out EPA this will be provided by the EPAO or CoC as and where required.

### Certification Process

On completion of the EPA, the AWO will be informed of the EPA result, they will then pass this information onto the CoC for apprentices to be informed. In the event of a fail an action plan will be developed by the AWO/CoC, and a re-test or re-sit will be organised by the EPAO.
