Putting Military experience to work

Served 22 years in the army before joining the team at WFS.

“I was involved in numerous overseas tours and inspection visits including both Gulf Wars, Bosnia, Kenya, the Falklands, Belize, Canada, Germany and Afghanistan.

In many ways, I can relate the roles I have had within WFS to what I did in the Army, though in the commercial sector you have to take on other considerations too; ensuring the operation/project is financially sustainable.

My thoughts about a second career while serving came rather late and is something I slightly regret; I would encourage anyone to think of the future and personal development early on. However, the values and standards the Army instils, and operates by, serves you in very good stead post your military career.

On reaching the rank of Warrant Officer I started working in the Staff environment where I was very much involved in operational planning and project work. This experience developed further as I progressed to the top of my rank structure and served my final few years at HQ Land Forces. This enabled me to be more active and involved at senior management levels and the higher/strategic side of planning. As my time in the

Army came to an end I realised that this was the direction I wanted to go in and it also put me in line with the opportunities at WFS.

At WFS I have had varying roles and opportunities at differing levels of operational management, from working on NATO and UN bids, to the Senior Operations Manager (UK) for the Global Physical Operations Aviation Department. Now I am the Global Physical Operations Programme Manager and I have had the opportunity to put my military experience into the commercial world and also develop my project management expertise. Roughly half of our London based team have military experience and through our military service we inherited a strong work ethic and the value of team spirit. At WFS we're always looking for the right people with a certain skill set across a range of disciplines - such as drivers, mechanics, HR, finance, sales, supply and procurement.

The shared knowledge of military expertise and values in our team is a critical foundation for success.
